The significant terms of the ALS 360 Program are listed below:

- 10-year term, which is cancellable if the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) does not approve funding in any year (the County would be responsible for shipping the equipment back).
- Payments of \$1,222,899 for years 1 - 9, plus a payment of \$478,948.07 in the 10th year.
- Additional payment of \$736,336.05 in the 10th year if the County exercises its right to purchase the 5-year old equipment (if the County does not exercise its right to purchase the equipment, it will be responsible for shipping costs to send all the equipment back to Stryker).
- In months 36 to 60, the County has the option to upgrade any or all of the equipment; the County only pays shipping to return old equipment back to Stryker.
- In the 60th month, for any old equipment the County has not upgraded, Stryker will send new equipment which most closely matches the old equipment at that time; County only pays shipping to return the old equipment.
- The Program includes regularly scheduled maintenance and on-site repairs of equipment (the County pays for repairs unless the repair is required due to malfunctioning of equipment).
