Funding: The Grant Applications are for a total of \$18.5 million for capital purchase with the following funding sources: FTA Federal Assistance of \$13.5 million, Florida Department of Transportation Toll Revenue Credits of \$2.3 million, and DEP Grant Funding of \$2.7 million. These capital assistance opportunities require variable rate local matches of between 10% and 20% depending on the item being purchased. The local match of \$2.3 million will be covered with soft match of Transportation Development Credits through the Florida Department of Transportation. Up to \$2.7 million in DEP Grant funding will serve as a local contribution towards the purchase of the electric buses.

1. Lots in the District are especially benefited, since street lighting not only increases the market value of an individual lot, but also increases safety in the District surrounding individual lots, and the ability of lot owners to use their individual lots after dark;
 2. The benefit from improved street lighting can vary according to the relative size of affected lots, but residential lots benefit uniformly because of the small variation in size throughout the District;
 3. The Non-Ad Valorem Special Assessments levied represent a fair and reasonable apportionment of the cost of the special benefit received by each lot, and do not represent a fair share of the cost of General Governmental Service provided to residents in the unincorporated areas of Escambia County, Florida;
 4. Lots which do not receive a special benefit have been and shall be excluded from the Non-Ad Valorem Special Assessment for street lighting; and
- B. Approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the Contract between Escambia County, Florida, and Florida Power and Light for the installation, operation, and maintenance of the lights.
