BACKGROUND SUMMARY:

The 401(a) plan is available for Escambia County employees in the Senior Management Services Class ("SMSC") and the Elected Officers' Class. The plan was established at the local level for those employees that meet certain criteria and opt out of the Florida Retirement System ("FRS").

In March 2016 the ICMA agreement was brought back to the Board of County Commissioners as an update. The contract remained in substantial form as the previous agreement approved in 1997. The rate of employer contribution is not specific; however, on page 2, under Contribution Provisions, the agreement sets the rate at the "***Rate of Contribution per Florida Retirement System."

Two things occurred back in time, very few employees opted out of the Florida Retirement System to enter into the local agency investment annuity and the employer contribution rates under FRS remained as a relatively low blended rate. It was not until a few years back, around 2011, that FRS management provided each component of the blended rate specific for pension and investment FRS plan types. The State of Florida did this for two reasons. First, there is a difference between a Defined Benefit Plan funding structure and a Contribution Plan. Second, the component known as the *unfunded actuarial liability* (UAL), only associated with the Defined Benefit Plan, was growing at a greater rate than incoming contributions and interest earnings. The UAL is the component calculated to shore up the financial viability of the FRS Defined Benefit Plan as a whole and not for the direct benefit of the individual.

It was at this juncture that Escambia County staff did not amend their procedure for communicating the percentage to be contributed to the ICMA 401(a) plan. The local agency plan does not have a UAL component because the ICMA 401(a) plan is a *contribution* plan. Contribution plans do not have the same benefit structure as the FRS Defined Benefit Program which always has an unfunded liability component. It is clear on the Uniform FRS Contribution Rates Effective July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022, that the FRS Defined Benefit Program has a UAL line item cost and the FRS Investment Plan does not.

It is for this reason that a correction is being made to the County contribution rate provided for the ICMA 401(a) plan. The County's workplace 401(a) account is a defined contribution plan sponsored by the employer. This type of plan has all of the same characteristics of the FRS Investment Plan; however, it is outside of the State of Florida retirement program and therefore does not require a blended rate payment to the County plan. The rate to be used is the line item titled "Employer Contribution to the Investment Plan Account." The local plan does not have a disability or death benefit component. To continue the current practice of using the FRS Blended Employer Contribution Rate, which includes the UAL component, is to grossly overfund individual 401(a) accounts. The FRS UAL cost component should never factor into a local agency contribution plan.

Summary: The purpose of this ordinance is to allow for an increased residential maximum density of 60 dwelling units per acre and a maximum intensity of 4.0 Floor Area Ratio (FAR) in the Mixed-Use Urban (MU-U) FLU and an increased maximum intensity of 2.5 FAR in the Commercial (C) FLU, but only for the 539.1 (+/-) acres located on the OLF-8 Master Plan District Site.

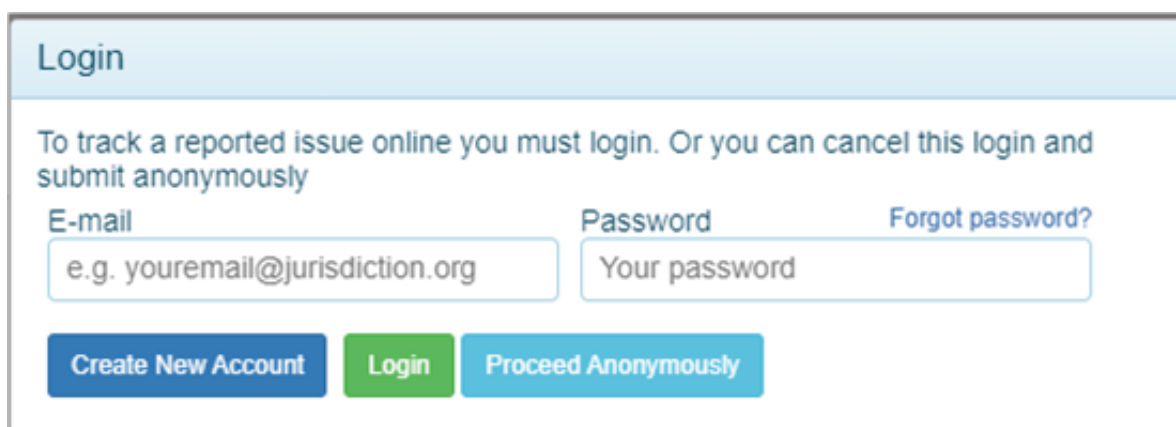
2. Recommendation Concerning Public Records and Privacy Disclaimers - Janice P. Gilley, County Administrator

That the Board discuss updates to the Public Records and Privacy Disclaimers for the County to include the IP Address as an identifier that may become public record if the original email is released to the public upon request. This will provide further notice to the public.

It is agreed with the Attorney General that “(a) person requesting access to or copies of public records, therefore, may not be required to disclose his (or her) name, address, telephone number or the like to the custodian, unless the custodian is required by law to obtain this information prior to releasing the records.” Op. Att’y Gen. Fla. 92–38 (1992) see also Op. Att’y Gen. Fla. (May 27, 2011) (informal opinion) (reiterating that an anonymous requestor may not be forced to disclose his or her name, address, telephone number, or similar identifying information)...The duty of a custodian to safeguard records is not sufficient to justify the imposition of an additional condition, which might for some have a chilling effect on access to public records. *Chandler v. City Of Greenacres*, 140 So. 3d 1080, 1084–85 (Fla. 4th DCA 2014).

It is common knowledge that providing a specific IP address is similar to providing the location or name of the person who sent the message. IP addresses are unique, and disclosing the IP address of the anonymous citizen in question could ultimately reveal that person’s identity and render them anonymous no more – which could be in violation of the law. So the County will change the disclaimers to appropriately notify the public.

On the MGO Public Records Request site it currently states an option to allow a constituent to Proceed Anonymously (See Below):

We will request MGO to put a disclaimer like the one below on this page:
“What if I want to remain anonymous?” You are not required to provide your name, address, telephone number or the like. To submit a public records request

to better ensure anonymity, you will not be able to use the online service or email. You may wish to call Escambia County Administration at (850) 595-4936; or stop by Escambia County Administration, 221 Palafox Place, Suite 420, Pensacola. PLEASE NOTE: Each anonymous request will be provided a reference number necessary for all follow-up inquiries.”

We will also need to change the language on our County Website: (See Below):

Public Records/FOIA Requests (myescambia.com) (Third Paragraph)

“When making a request, you will not be required to give your name or provide the reason for a request as a condition of fulfilling the request. Your request may be made by phone, letter or email. Under Florida law, email addresses and IP addresses are public records. If you do not want your email address or IP address released in response to a public records request, do not send your request electronically but make your request via phone. You may wish to call Escambia County Administration at (850) 595-4936; or stop by Escambia County Administration, 221 Palafox Place, Suite 420, Pensacola.”

We will also need to change the language that is tagged onto all County emails: (See Below):

Florida has a very broad public records law. Under Florida law, both the content of emails, email addresses and IP addresses are public records. If you do not want the content of your email, your email address, or your IP address released in response to a public records request, do not send electronic mail to this entity. Instead, contact this office by phone or in person.
